County of Ventura Human Services Agency 725 E. Main St, Suite 301 Santa Paula, CA (805) 933-8422	Provides information, takes applications and authorizes benefits for the following programs: CalWORKS, Food Stamps, General Relief and Medi-Cal.
Interface Children Family Services 940 E. Main St, Santa Paula, CA (805) 525-6616	Prevention, counseling, shelter, treatment and education programs for abused children, battered women and their children, high-risk and homeless youth and families in crisis.
St. Vincent de Paul at San Sebastian's Church 235 9 <sup>th</sup> St, Santa Paula, CA (805) 525-2149	Food, (bags of groceries for 80-90 families per week), clothing, toiletries, money for prescriptions, bus tokens, and vouchers for gasoline (emergency and for job search) to homeless and low-income families.
Catholic Charities of Ventura County 303 N. Ventura Ave, Suite A Ventura, CA (805) 643-4694	Budget counseling, temporary emergency assistance, seasonal utilities assistance, food, clothing, shelter vouchers, rental assistance and information, and referral.
Our Place - Turning Point Foundation 536 E. Thompson Blvd, Ventura, CA (805) 652-2151	10 beds for homeless mentally ill adults. Auxilliary services available include meals, showers, laundry facilities, daytime shelter, phone messages, housing referrals, outreach, assistance in filing for benefits, linkage to mental health.
Salvation Army - Ventura 650 S. Petit Ave, Ventura, CA (805) 659-3598	Emergency welfare help, food bags, transitional housing program for homeless families and single women.
Ventura County Rescue Mission 234 E. 6 <sup>th</sup> St, Oxnard, CA (805) 487-1234	Shelter for transient men for up to five consecutive nights; free one-year live-in alcohol and drug recovery program to individuals.
